



Using the 'No Outsiders' approach to teach the Equality Act (2010) in primary schools

What is Everyone's Welcome?

Everyone's Welcome uses the 'No Outsiders' resource and framework to teach the Equality Act (2010) to primary school children.

No Outsiders was written by Andrew Moffat (MBE), a Deputy Head Teacher in Birmingham. The approach uses assemblies and story books to teach children about all aspects of difference and diversity. These principles are promoted in the Equality Act (2010) and are in line with British Values.

The Law

The Equality Act (2010) requires that schools promote all aspects of difference and diversity. It is a legal requirement for schools to eliminate discrimination based on the protected characteristics: Age; Disability; Gender Reassignment; Marriage and Civil Partnership; Pregnancy or Maternity; Religion or Belief; Race; Sex; Sexual Orientation

Ofsted

When visiting schools, Ofsted will look at the provision for pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development. Inspectors will ask schools to demonstrate **how** they teach about different families; tackle homophobic, biphobic and transphobic bullying and promote British Values. Everyone's Welcome will help schools to achieve this.
